Pastor's Thoughts

For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus...therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.”

Romans 3:22b-24, 5:1-2

We have different motivations for giving.

Sometimes we give out of a sense of obligation; because we should, because we feel like we have to, because we feel like it is our duty.

We are by definition, members of the Body of Christ who are called to share the gifts that have been given to us in ways that mutually build up the body and contribute to the well-being of the whole. In this way, then, we are under obligation to give. Not because it is demanded, but because it is expected as ones who are defined by God's grace.

Sometimes we give out of a sense of investment; expecting that there is a return on our giving; benefits—whether an immediate impact that we can be part of or a future-oriented impact for others yet to come. There is a guaranteed return and, in terms of investment, the return is said to be 100 fold. The return does not, however, go into our bank account or into the church's bank account. The return comes rather in a network of family relationships and in a hope that is beyond value and price. We invest not for the benefits of individual return, but rather to stand in God's promise of grace.

Sometimes we give to make a tangible difference; we see a need and know that by giving we can fulfill that need; we get a sense of direct accomplishment and of making a difference that we can see. There are those who have been given the gift of generosity and who look for various ways to give. There is great joy in being able to give and to give specifically in order to accomplish a goal or objective. Giving to make a difference can stretch us, can help us reorder priorities, and can give us a sense of satisfaction. Giving is not really about what we are set on accomplishing, but it opens our lives to participate in God's grace.

I think that within all of these motivations God's grace is central. I think that the name for our electronic giving, Simply Giving, is aptly named and echoes this sense of grace or giving in grace when we simply give, with intentionality, timeliness, and discipline. On November 18th we will come together as a congregation to vote on a budget for 2013. I am hoping that the budget will not become your frame for giving. The budget is only a spending plan and is more about maintenance and a minimum number that allows us to keep doing what we are doing now—than it is about our potential for mission and ministry. I hope that you will pray about the relationship you have with God, will be stirred by God's gift of grace for you and will be open to a grace-filled giving that has much greater potential than meeting a budget.

I have personally asked our leadership team to consider individual giving increases and have offered my own 10% increase. Allow me to ask you the same. For anyone who is giving \$50 or less on a weekly basis, I would ask that you stretch to increase \$5 a week. If you have not been giving an offering, consider a monthly gift or a quarterly gift. For anyone giving more that \$50 a week, I would ask you to stretch with a 10% increase in your giving.

There will be some of you who will be able to make this stretch, some who will be able to increase at a smaller level, and some who will be able to give significantly more. Together, we have a greater capacity to give than we are currently sharing.

I am thankful for all that we have been able to accomplish together, thankful for the extra work that individuals have done to supplement our giving with works-in-kind, and thankful for our partnership in ministry and the possibilities for additional ministry that is within our capacity.

May God's grace continue to rest on you and inspire you to be an expression of that grace in all that you do.

The Ridge: The Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg Reflection, November 2012

What an exciting annual event it is! The Luther Colloquy at our Gettysburg Seminary emerges as a unique opportunity for enriching Luther and Reformation studies. The date is perfect this year-October 31. Our thoughts can easily scurry then to other significant somewhat related anniversaries, like perhaps the fifty year Second Vatican Council event, and, of course, the five hundred year "down the road" 95 Theses Reformation kick-off memory. Specifically though, this Colloquy will see the **Institute for Luther Studies** at the Seminary offering lectures on Lutherans and marriage both from historical and from contemporary perspectives. Noted speakers come from Boston University and Emory University. Both Drs. John Witte and Christopher Boyd Brown are theologically prominent on many current fronts. There will be archival events featuring Dr. Karin Bohleke also, and for the closing Eucharist / Worship my cherished Professor, the Rev. Dr. Mark Vitalis-Hoffman will preach with his wife, the Rev. Kathy Vitalis-Hoffman presiding. I'll be getting a chance to go down to the Colloquy with a friend, and it will feel so good to be in the Church of the Abiding Presence again with the Seminary community.

MISSION TRIP OPPORTUNITY FOR SHARON YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS AND CHURCHES IN THE UPPER SUSQUEHANNA SYNOD

The LutheranHANDS Foundation is a not-for-profit organization that provides mission trips and service opportunities for its community of believers looking to answer God's call to serve.

Participants of our mission trips experience a unique week diverse with work, play, song, dance, prayer, and teaching. We have integrated mission work into a "camp-like experience" where we get up early to work in communities needing our help and end the day with evenings of recreation, large group events, small group discussions, devotions, and worship.

For the last 4 years, LutheranHANDS has been planning and leading mission trips to various parts of the country in response to natural disasters...New Orleans - Hurricane Katrina, Indiana - flooding, Nashville - flooding, and Birmingham - tornado relief. Each trip was planned to accommodate up to 200 youth, young adults, and adult leaders from the Lower Susquehanna Synod where LutheranHANDS was born. This year, the organizers of LutheranHANDS have incorporated as the not-for-profit "The LutheranHANDS Foundation", filed a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt not-for-profit application, and are planning a geographical expansion of offerings across the country starting with our neighbor synods.

In the summer of 2013, LutheranHANDS will be leading two mission trips within the U.S. and one to an international location. You are invited to participate in those trips as groups or as individuals looking for ways to serve.

The LutheranHANDS Advantage:

- For youth - a LutheranHANDS mission trip is a great opportunity to strengthen your faith through service to new communities as part of a dynamic and energetic family of Lutherans
- For young adults - a LutheranHANDS mission trip is an opportunity to develop your leadership and mentorship of your peers while identifying ways to integrate service into your daily lives
- For youth leaders - LutheranHANDS is an easy way to provide a mission trip to your youth group where all the planning and execution is done for you
- For adults, pastors, and other lay persons - LutheranHANDS provides another arena for you to teach the Word to young people and all the satisfaction that comes with it

NOTES FROM EVERGREEN CEMETERY

At their May and August meetings, the members of the Evergreen Cemetery Association Committee made and approved revisions to the cemetery rules. As individuals and families purchase grave lots at the cemetery, they will be provided with a copy of the rules when they receive the deed for their lot. For current owners of lots, we would like to provide the following information to you as an update, primarily concerning the new prices of lots and the revisions concerning decorations which may be left on grave sites.

1. The current prices for purchasing lots for burial rights are as follows:

--\$300.00 per single-grave lot

--\$500.00 per two-grave lot

--\$900.00 per four-grave lot

2. Decorations in Memory of Loved Ones

- a. In May, before the annual Memorial Day holiday, local veterans' organizations will place American flags in pre-placed holders on the grave sites of deceased military veterans. These flags will remain in place in their holders until the week after Veterans' Day, when cemetery personnel will remove them and return them to the veterans' organizations for proper disposal.
- b. Flowers and plants (live or artificial) may be placed in appropriate, removable containers on top of grave markers. When live flowers/plants become wilted or die, cemetery personnel will remove and dispose of the flowers/plants and containers.
- c. No fences or enclosures of any kind will be permitted on burial lots. Borders around grave markers of stone, gravel, mulch or similar decorative materials are not permitted. The planting of trees, shrubbery, flowers, plants or vines of any kind on lots is strictly prohibited.
- d. The placing of boxes, shelves, toys, statuettes, glassware, plaques, lanterns, solar lights, chimes or similar items upon grave markers or lots is not permitted. Cemetery personnel will dispose of such items found on graves.
- e. No person shall scatter or deposit glass, rubbish, cast-off grave decorations or other refuse on any lots or driveways of the cemetery under penalty of arrest, but shall convey the same to the receptacle(s) provided for that purpose, located beside the shed on the cemetery grounds.

Simply Giving

Members can elect to have your bank charge your account for the amount and frequency you select. The church's checking account is then deposited indicating your contribution. To begin, stop by the church office (Mon. – Fri. 8:30am to 4:30pm.) Bring along a voided bank check of your account, sign an authorization form and Carrie will take care of setting this up.

Stitchers, a long-standing working committee and volunteer ministry team at Sharon, has been involved in two Lutheran World Relief projects for many years. The team members create and sew handcrafted quilts and school kits.

This year, the group made 119 quilts and 25 school kits which were displayed in the nave and narthex on Blanket Sunday, October 7, for both services. Stitchers also greeted at the two services. Pastor Doll blessed the quilts and school kits, and recognized the Stitchers.

Monday, October 8, 2012, Stitchers packed 101 quilts and 45 school kits (25 assembled by Stitchers and 20 assembled by others in the congregation) to send to Lutheran World Relief. Eighteen quilts were taken to Haven Ministry, our supported local mission.

For your information, since the writer has been keeping records (for about 15 years), Stitchers have made over one thousand quilts and 565 school kits.

The Stitchers are grateful for all the donations of fabric, money from individuals and money allocated by members of Thrivent. With these funds, the Stitchers were able to purchase rolls of fill, fabric, items to fill school kits, and sewing supplies. Any monetary or fabric donations are greatly appreciated.


